Reflections On This Week's Readings

June 20, 2010

Luke 9:18-24

Peter makes a declaration of faith! He recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, but has no proof. But he has faith. Jesus is not one to let Peter or us off the hook. Jesus clearly tells his disciples and the crowd that there is a cost to being a follower. You must be willing to lose yourself and go where Jesus leads, even if that means changing your way of thinking and living, suffering injustice or loss of comforts.

Can a stranger tell the difference between you and an atheist?

Which of Jesus' footsteps would you find it impossible to walk in? Why?

Second Reading Galatians 5:1, 13-18

A proper use of freedom includes service to others, motivated by love.

Gospel Luke 9:51-62

Today's reading give us examples of ways we can respond to the Lord's call. Elisha abandons his livelihood and his family to become Elijah's attendant. The Lord Jesus demands a single-hearted response to the call to follow him. Saint Paul reminds us that when we say "yes" to the Lord, much is demanded of us. Saint Paul tells us that our response is summed up in one statement: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Youth Ministry Summer Mission Trips

It's time again to make your plans for summer mission trips. This year, due to the fact that our participants in these service weeks keep growing, there will be four weeks of mission trips offered for all of our young parishioners who are currently in sixth grade through high school.

High School Youth in Grades 10th – 12th: Habitat for Humanity in Yakima, Washington during the week of **Sunday, August 1st through Friday, August 6th**. **Volunteers must be at least 16 years old.**

Current 9th graders: ONE WEEK Senior High through the Archdiocese of Seattle is a week-long service learning experience designed to help high students change their perspective so they can make a difference in their world. We will be going to Forks during the week of **Sunday, July 11th through Friday, July 16th**.

Current 8th graders: We will again be participating in the **Youth Migrant Project** in the Skagit Valley during the week of **Sunday, July 18th through Friday, July 23rd**. Join us for a week of service and fun, as we work with migrant workers and their families. There are opportunities to work in the daycare or the food and clothing bank. We will spend time at the migrant worker camps and experience what it is like to work in the fields.

Current 6th and 7th graders: ONE WEEK Junior High will be in Snohomish County during the week of **Sunday, August 8th through Friday, August 13th**. We will be doing service projects to help the community in that area, such as doing yard work, painting, or working at a food bank.

Saint of the Month St. Margaret of Scotland June 10

Margaret was born in Saxony and raised in Hungary. She came to Scotland in 1066 as a refugee when William the Conqueror invaded England and became king and the English court was no longer a safe place for Margaret. She and her family were welcomed to Scotland by King Malcolm. Malcolm fell in love with Margaret and they were married. They were very different. She was quiet, holy, prayerful and kind. Malcolm was noisy, rough, rude and warlike.

Margaret set about to change her husband and his home. She brought fashions and manners from the continent and ceremony to the Scottish court. The introduction of the fashions from the continent increased economic ties between Scotland and the continent.

Margaret was also known for her works of charity. She visited the sick and fed the hungry. She was also known for her activities in reforming the church in Scotland and developing closer ties with the church in Rome in order to avoid a schism.
